WHEN WE MUST WAIT FOR GOD

Life demands patience... and lots of it! We live in an imperfect world inhabited by imperfect people. Sometimes, we inherit troubles from others, and sometimes we create trouble for ourselves. In either case, what's required is patience.

Lamentations 3:25 reminds us that, “*The Lord is good unto them that wait for Him, to the soul that seeketh Him.*” But, for most of us, waiting quietly for God is difficult. Why? Because we are fallible human beings, sometimes quick to anger and sometimes slow to forgive.

The next time you find your patience tested to the limit, remember that the world unfolds according to God's timetable, not ours, knowing that God's timing is always best.
